This summer we will conduct our eighth annual "Junior B/C" sessions at three locations: July 10-14 in Indiana; July 14-18 in Georgia; and July 21-25 in Pennsylvania


Our "Junior B/C" format is similar to regular B/C except for added emphasis on fundamentals (team practice, station drills). Each camper plays at least 3 games daily.

Previous "Junior B/C" sessions have been blessed with abundant talent as well as size. Among the All-American graduates are Tennessee's 6-6 junior guard Allan Houston, 1991 SEC Tournament MVP and 1992 All-American, and Indiana's All-Big Ten center 6-9 Eric Anderson.

"Junior B/C's" latest phenom — 6-3 Terrence Rencher, who's averaged 19 ppg as a Texas freshman All-American after his '89 B/C-Pennsylvania debut.
