SCHEDULE B/C All-Stars challenges its campers with the most demanding daily camp schedule in America. You're the best and you deserve the opportunity to show it! Here's a composite rundown on

DAILY

MORNINGS: Campers participate in individual instruction, usually in the form of station drills where fundamentals such as shooting, ball-handling and defense are taught by our staff coaches and college counselors. Ample time is alotted for team practice where various offenses and defenses are mastered. Lectures are scheduled either late in the morning or early in the afternoon.

B/C's format:

AFTERNOONS: Each camper participates in a block of two out of four games. Camp coaches are instructed to delegate equal time to all players and no team will include more than 10 players. EVENINGS: Each camper again plays a

block of two out of four games - the most daily competition at any camp in CAMP CHAMPIONSHIPS AND ALL-

STAR GAMES: Our Final Four playoffs, featuring the four teams who compile the best records in daily camp play, are conducted Friday morning. Two All-Star Games, a Top 20 and Second 20 matched up talent-wise and heightwise, are held Friday afternoon. No camp anywhere packs more into one

week. It's a competitive challenge and our campers meet it!

#### DATES: B/C's 1985 summer schedule consists of three one-week sessions. They are June 16-21 in Rensselaer, Indiana . . . June 23-28 in Gettysburg, Pennsylvania . . . July 14-19 in Milledgeville, Georgia.

LOCATIONS: Milledgeville is a collegeatmosphere community of 15,000 situated in Central Georgia, 93 miles southeast of Atlanta. Rensselaer is an agricultural community of 5,000 located in Northwest Indiana, 73 miles southeast of Chicago. Gettysburg is an historical town of 7,200 located in south-central Pennsylvania, 58 miles from Baltimore,

FACILITIES: Georgia College and Georgia Military College are the Milledgeville base of operations. St. Joseph's College is the Rensselaer headquarters. Gettysburg College is the Gettysburg headquarters. Air-conditioned dorms are available at all sites. High school and city gymnasiums also will be used CHECK-IN: Campers should report to the St.



CHECK-OUT: Campers will be dismissed by 5 p.m. Friday of each camp. All rooms will be checked before departure. Camp is OFFICIALLY CLOSED at 5 p.m. and there will not be any room or board provided after that time. Motels are available at area airports for those departing on Saturday morning.

FOOD: Meals will be served from Sunday night through Friday afternoon. Snack bar facilities

## **COST AND MEDICAL**

All-inclusive tuition fee is \$240.00 per session. A \$140.00 nonrefundable deposit is required when application is returned to guarantee you a position in camp. Once camp participation has begun, players are not eligible for refunds of the final \$100.00. Your cancelled check will serve as your receipt and acceptance. Please keep this brochure and your B/C Entrance Requirements and Transportation checklists with you at all times. IMPORTANT: The final balance of \$100.00 is due at least 14 days before camp unless prior arrangement has been made with B/C Co-Director Bill Cronauer. This allows enough time for your check to clear the bank and be posted on your application card. If your final tuition has not been received prior to enrollment, you must pay at Sunday registration by cash or money order. NO CHECKS WILL BE ACCEPTED Each camper must provide evidence of a physical examination and proof of family medical insurance coverage (if you have home coverage) before you are able to participate in camp. No physicals will be given at camp. Please make sure your physician or school doctor signs the medical information panel on back of your application card and make sure your parents have signed the release statement which allows our physicians to provide emergency treatment if needed. Please read physical examination section carefully

NOTE: All campers will be accepted for the week of their choice unless otherwise notified. There will be no further letter of confirmation. You are fully enrolled and only need to appear your respective Sunday for

sweat socks, shorts, T-shirts, towels and toilet articles. Also bring an alarm clock. Leave all valuables at home as the camp is not responsible for lost articles. Do not bring expensive

radios and tape players.

INSURANCE AND MEDICAL CARE: Each camper must provide proof of family medical insurance coverage, which includes policy number, name of company and company address (see application card). Professional trainers are on duty during camp activities. Fulltime doctors and nurses are on call around the clock at campus health centers or city hospitals. Because of the rigorous daily schedule, each camper should come to camp in peak physical

PHYSICAL EXAMINATION: In the interest of the campers' health, we require both a parental



permit slip and a physical examination. A copy

of any physical signed within the past year by a licensed physician will be accepted. Health in-
